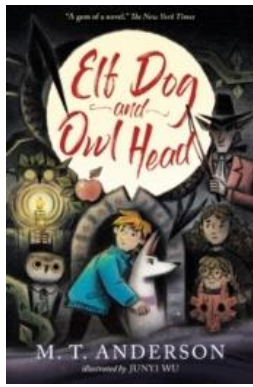

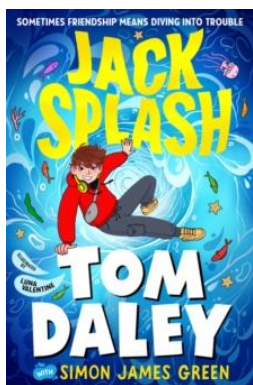
SUMMARIES
